Turn your home into a fire shield with these tips.

EXTERIOR

Retrofit home with non- flammable building materials such as stucco or brick for exterior walls	Replace wood roofs with non-flammable building materials including asphalt shingles	Install spark arresters in chimneys
Apply non-combustible screens to all vent or eave openings	Do not connect wood fencing directly to your home	Install and maintain an irrigation system such as outdoor sprinklers
 Remove any flammable vegetation or materials at least: Five feet from your home and driveway 10 feet from the road, and 	 Establish and maintain a 100-foot safe zone around your house that will act as a fuel break The 30 feet closest to the home should be green and clean landscaping with no flammable plants The next 70 feet should have thinned vegetation, removing flammable plants and brush 	 Remove any dead overhanging tree branches above the road and building structure roof(s) All trees should be at least 10 feet from any dwelling and at least 18 feet apart in your home's intermediate zone, and 12 feet apart in the extended zone
Clear roof surfaces, gutters and eaves of leaves, pine needles and branches regularly to avoid accumulation of flammable materials	Keep trees and shrubs pruned	Remove dead or dying trees and plants on or near your property

Wildfire Home Preparedness Checklist

EXTERIOR (Cont.)

Store flammable liquids away from occupied buildings	 Move flammable and combustible items such as propane tanks, firewood, picnic tables and boats at least 50 feet away from your home and other structures 	 Check hoses and sprinkler systems to ensure you can spray your roof and exterior walls with water Make sure a ladder is accessible for hard to reach areas
Locate an easily accessible external water source, such as a pool, small pond or water storage tank and put up signage "emergency water source" for first responders	If your main water source is a well, install an emergency generator to operate the pump in case of a power failure	Make sure your street address is visible from the street
Your driveway should be at least 12 feet wide with		

a vertical clearance of at least 15 feet high

INTERIOR

Remove plants or any combustible items near windows or doors as embers can enter through gaps	 Store fire extinguishers in: Kitchen By front and rear exits of the house At least one on each floor, if your house has multiple stories 	Have fire extinguishers inspected and certified annually by a fire protection equipment company
Train your family how to use the fire extinguishers	 Locate and make note of the gas, water and electricity main shut-off controls, and learn how to safely shut them down Keep an emergency gas and water shut-off tool near the shut-off valves 	Create a detailed home inventory – document and save valuable possessions through photos or videos and digitally back up in a secure Cloud storage site

Assess your insurance coverage annually, including updating your home inventory and letting your agent know about home renovations
